

Using MakeMake on the Web

New to Color Fonts?

Don't worry. If you've ever embedded a webfont before, you're already 90% of the way there.

The only new thing you'll learn is how to switch between MakeMake's built-in color palettes.

Both webfont formats are included for maximum browser compatibility.

AVAILABLE PALETTES

ID	Palette	CSS name
0	Aurora	--Aurora
1	Creamcicle	--Creamcicle
2	Rocket	--Rocket
3	Orchid	--Orchid
4	Acid	--Acid
5	Lavender	--Lavender
6	Solaris	--Solaris
7	Gum	--Deep
8	Clouds	--Clouds
9	Paradise	--Paradise

Need more control?

MakeMake also includes a layered version.

Use the three individual layer fonts in Illustrator, Affinity Designer, or your preferred design software to create your own color combinations. When you're working on the web, the Color Font version lets you switch between eight curated palettes using CSS.

CocijoType

STEP 1. Create your project

Create a folder with the following structure:

```
my-folder/  
  index.html  
  style.css  
  fonts/  
    MakeMake-Web.woff2  
    MakeMake-Web.woff
```

STEP 2. Create a css file (a txt and you save it with css extension)

Copy and paste the code to load the font:

```
@font-face {  
  font-family: "MakeMake";  
  src:  
    url("fonts/MakeMake-Web.woff2") format("woff2"),  
    url("fonts/MakeMake-Web.woff") format("woff");  
}
```

Next, define one of the built-in color palettes:

```
@font-palette-values --Aurora {  
  font-family: MakeMake;  
  base-palette: 0;  
}
```

You can repeat this for all ten palettes or to try another look, simply replace --Aurora with any of the other built-in palette names.

Finally, add this code below to style your text and assign a color palette.

```
h1 {  
  font-family: MakeMake;  
  font-size: 72px;  
  margin: 10px 0 0 0;  
  padding: 50px;  
  text-align: left;  
}  
  
h1.Aurora {  
  font-palette: --Aurora;  
}
```

STEP 3. Create your HTML

Create another text file, save it as index.html, and paste in the following code:

```
<!DOCTYPE html>  
<html lang="en">  
<head>  
<meta charset="utf-8">  
<link rel="stylesheet" href="style.css">  
</head>  
  
<body>  
  
<h1>Tight-Not-Touching</h1>  
  
</body>  
</html>
```

STEP 4. Open your page

Double-click index.html (or open it in your favorite browser). If everything is set up correctly, you should see your text rendered with the selected MakeMake color palette.
